

How COVID-19 Spreads



PEOPLE

This disease can spread from person to person through small droplets from the nose or the mouth when the infected person coughs or exhales



SURFACES

These small droplets land on surfaces, which means any person that touches these surfaces and then their eyes, nose or mouth can become infected

The best way to prevent the spread



Wash your hands often for at least 20 seconds



Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth, especially with unwashed hands



Cough and sneeze into your sleeve and not hands



Practice physical distancing at all times (at least 2 meters)




Stay home if you are sick



Wear a non-medical or face covering to cover the nose and mouth
