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During this semester you will continue to work on communication skills through activities and exercises in all of the six receptive and expressive strands: reading, writing, speaking, listening, viewing, and representing. To accomplish this, you will be engaged in many meaningful language arts experiences to explore how language is used both by yourself and others.

Re-writes

Re-writes will **not be permitted** for students how hand in work late and/or have not completed all of the formative work for the assignment (e.g. drafts, peer reviews, etc.).

Appeal Procedures:

Any mark may be appealed. A student should **first discuss the matter with the teacher** before referring it to the principal.

Submission of Assignments

Most assignments are to be submitted in paper copy, email or Quest A +.

Late Assignments:

Each student is responsible for submitting work on time. All late work handed in more than 3 days from the due date, and without a reasonable excuse, may be marked and inputted into Power School later in the semester. Please note that work within a given unit MUST be submitted within 5 days of the unit's completion.
