


Time to Start Thinking About Next Year

- Course Selection Forms will be distributed on Monday, Feb. 28, 2022, in Advisory.
- Forms are to be returned to block 1 teachers on or before Friday March 4, 2022.
- Course selections are based on current grades. Students can make changes to selection when their grade is above the recommended pre-requisite grade.
- Parent signature is required. Students who DO NOT submit a form, will not be registered for their courses until the Course Registration Form is completed.
- Students will be called down to the Learning Commons according to Advisory.

 - Tuesday, March TBA gr. 10's
 - Wednesday, March TBA gr. 9's

High School Diploma Requirements:

- ◆ A minimum of 100 credits
- ◆ English Language Arts at the 30 level (30-1 or 30-2)
- ◆ Social Studies at the 30 level (30-1 or 30-2)
- ◆ Math at the 20 level (5 credits)
- ◆ Science at the 20 level (5 credits)
- ◆ Physical Education 10 (3 or 5 credits)
- ◆ Career and Life Management (3 credits)
- ◆ 10 credits in any 30 level courses
- ◆ 10 credits in option courses

Grade 12

- All students MUST register for 30 credits
- Two spares (one each semester if on track to graduate)
- All students should have a minimum of 110 credits by the end of Gr. 12

Gr. 10 = 40 credits

Gr. 11 = 40 credits

Gr. 12 = 30 credits

Total = 110 credits

Application for an Extra Spare Students can apply for an extra spare in the fall if: They are on-track to graduate Are easily on track to graduate with 105 plus credits.

We Connect (On-line Courses) Guidelines

A student may be granted a We Connect block under the following circumstances:

- A course does not fit in his/her schedule i.e. Course conflict
- There is not a viable in-class option ie. Class is full
- Graduation credits are required
- Space is available
- Approval is granted by an administrator

What do you need to get into university?




Admission mostly based on <u>5</u> courses (usually)

 - ♦ Start researching specific institutions and programs you are interested in BEFORE you choose courses!





"Waive the Recommended Pre-requisite Mark Form"

- If a student is not meeting the recommended pre-requisite grade but is passing the course student and parent can submit a "Waive the Pre-requisite Recommended Mark" form link to form on SCHS website click on "Registration and Course Planing" –right hand side and scroll down
- must attach "Waive Recommended Pre-requisite Mark" form to course registration form
- Student and parent must include 3 strategies for success in their appeal.

Tip: 3-credit courses

Geography 30 and History 30

- Recommended prerequisite: at least a 65% in Social Studies 10-1 or 10-2
- These two course when combined together can be used as a 5th option course for many (not all) university programs

Experimental Psychology 30 and Applied Sociology 30

- Recommended prerequisite: General Psychology 20
- These two course when combined together can be used as a 5th option course for many (not all) university programs

Work Experience

- HCS 3000 (1 credit) is the pre-requisite
- 25 hours = 1 credit
- Must guarantee the program a minimum of 75 hours
- Available as a Summer School program

Registered Apprenticeship Program

• The Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) is a way for high school students to become apprentices, and earn credits toward an apprenticeship program and a high school diploma at the same time

Green Certificate

This program is administered by the Government of Alberta (Alberta Agriculture). The program is delivered off campus and students may earn credits for successfully completing the Green Certificate program. Students must be 15 years or older and can register for one of the nine specializations available: Bee Keeper Production, Cow-Calf Beef Production, Dairy Production, Equine Technician, Feedlot Beef Production, Field Crop Prouduction, Sheep and Swine production, and Irrigated Field Crop Production.

Dual Credit Programs

A dual credit course allows a high school student to obtain both secondary and post-secondary credits (concurrently)

SAIT Dual Credit: Financing Venture

Pre-requisite: Social Studies 10 and CALM

- In partnership with SAIT we are happy to offer this dual credit course. Upon successful completion of all the modules students will receive Management 200 credits with SAIT. Major concepts of study will
- include: human resources, finance, marketing, accounting, supply chain management and management.

$U\ of\ C\ Dual\ Credit/Psyc\ 203$ (The Psychology of Everyday Life)

Pre-requisite (one of the following): General Psych 20, Personal Psych 20, Experimental Psych 30, Abnormal Psych 35

- PSYCH 203 is structured so high school students will receive 3 U of C credits in Psychology as well as 5 grade 12 option credits at the high school level.
- Topics include:
 - Research Methods
 - Stress and Coping
 - Personality Theories
 - The Self and Identity
 - Social thinking and Social Influence
 - Mental Health and Wellness
 - Career Development




