Minister's Youth Concil:

As a follow up to Minister Eggen's announcement earlier today, he would like to provide you with details on Alberta Education's Minister's Youth Council.

The new Minister's Youth Council aligns with Alberta Education's desire to ensure that students have the opportunity to provide input on education initiatives and engage with the ministry as partners. It gives the Minister of Education and Alberta Education the ability to recognize student voice and engage with a representative group of students across Alberta.

### Purpose, Selection Criteria and Term for the Minister's Youth Council

The council will consist of approximately 32 junior and senior high school students with diverse interests, identities, backgrounds and perspectives from all regions of Alberta.

It will be a 10-month term that will align with the school year beginning in 2017-18. As council members, students will meet three times during the school year: September, February and May. Meetings will begin Friday evening and run through to Monday afternoon. As well, there will be an opportunity for the students to interact with each other outside of these meetings to discuss ideas and upcoming activities.

### Process and Deadline for Submissions for the Minister's Youth Council

Interested junior and senior high school students can apply directly to Alberta Education by May 5, 2017. Information and steps on how to apply can be found on the <u>Alberta</u> <u>Education Student Engagement website</u>.

## **RVS Ward Boundary Review.**

The Board voted on the bylaw that will see a change in RVS wards. Due to growth in Chestermere, Airdrie, and Cochrane the dynamics in RVS has changed. The Board has approved a plan to add one trustee (total 8)

1 in rural SE, 1 in Chestermere, 1 in rural NE, 3 Airdrie, 1 Cochrane, and 1 in West RVS.

Ward 4 and 5 to be combined. (SMS, SCHS, EEVE, Banded Peak, Bearspaw and Westbrook) More info on RVS website.

### 2017 School Board Elections

Elections will be held on Monday, October 16. Nomination day is 4 weeks prior to election day which will be Monday, Sept. 18. More information is available on the ASBA (Alberta School Board Association) website.

### Provincial Budget

Budget to be tabled March 16. Rumoured to include growth funding and funding for 10 new schools. The government has committed to a 25% reduction in school fees. Boards are anxiously waiting to see how the shortage will be covered. Transportation is already a challenge impacted by the carbon tax.

## **RVS Budget Planning**

In preparation for budget development for the 2017/18 school year the board has identified its priorities. These will guide the budget process and direct expenditures. The Board has directed that the emphasis be on the following priorities:

- Direct classroom supports to enhance student achievement
- School-based services for inclusive learning environments
- Specialized and wrap-around services for students with complex & emotional needs
- Literacy, numeracy, and 21<sup>st</sup> C skills and knowledge

## RVS 2018-2020 Capital Plan

Every April school boards submit an updated capital plan. Since there have been no new school approvals since October 2015 RVS is once again in critical need of space. The capital plan will come to the board on March 16. Once again due to the increased growth and need for student learning spaces the need for new spaces impacts

modernizations.
